If your office gets TIME Magazine for your waiting room, please do yourself and loved ones a BIG favor read the March 5, 2018 issue! Entitled the "The Opioid Diaries" and it is the first time in the 95-year history of "Time Magazine" that they have dedicated an entire issue on one issue and one photographer's work. Through the lenses of photographer James Nachtwey and the writing of Paul Moakley, we can directly see the national tragedy that is unfolding before us. http://time.com/opioid-addiction-epidemic-in-america/ This national epidemic affects us all. As prescribers, we are very much directly affected. As taxpayers, we are affected. As citizens, it affects our friends, associates,

and families. You may think or say "not my family, not my patients, not in my neighborhood or schools." Please do not be blind as the pages of Time reveals in black & white what is occurring in America. The buck stops here. Everyone must play a role in stopping this epidemic. For us as dentists, we really need to guard our prescription pads, count out really how many pain pills that patient will really need, use the PDMP, and review medical histories including asking probing questions of your patients. Not just "have there been any changes in your medical history?"

Let me give you an example that occurred just this week in my office. A 22-year-old male came in for a "check-up & cleaning." We had not seen him for a couple of years and he relayed how his dad has been very ill and how he himself had been going through some chronic back pain. His mannerisms where rather manic and by asking probing questions, the dental hygienist was able to elicited that he has been abusing his prescriptions plus use of illegal drugs. Thanks to the action of an alert dental hygienist and my calling the patients primary care physician, we were able to get this young man some help. Did we save a life? Hard to say for the road to recovery as illustrated in TIME is a rocky road. But, at least it got him pointed in the right direction. This story also illustrates the need for all of us to work as a medical team for the best care for our patient's overall health, not just a great smile.

If you are still not convinced after reading the TIME magazine, then join me the morning of Friday April 13 at the Southern Maryland Dental Society classroom as we review the State Dental Board required course on Prescription Drug Writing. The dental profession needs to be front and center in reversing this national opioid crisis!

Leadership Update

Message from Dr. O'Loughlin



As you probably saw in Dr. Crowley's Jan. 22 ADA News piece, "Preventing opioid abuse from the dental chair," dentistry is at a crossroads when it comes to prescribing opioids for dental pain. More than 42,000 opioid-related deaths occurred in the U.S. in 2016 — more than any year on record. This doesn't count the nearly 2 million Americans who reported abusing or being dependent upon prescription pain relievers or the unknown number whose addiction to heroin and other illicit drugs started with a prescription pain reliever.

The Council on Government Affairs met last week to discuss the prevailing view that health professionals have not offered genuine solutions to reduce opioid prescribing. The ADA was also present at the White House Summit on Opioids, and hosted a meeting between the American Medical Association, American Pharmacists Association, and Chicago-area government officials

at our headquarters. And in the coming weeks, the ADA will be meeting with leaders at the U.S. Food and Drug Administration and the National Institute on Drug Abuse. These efforts will inform our response going forward, which will likely include increased education on the proven efficacy of non-opioids for the management of acute pain and dentistry's recognition of the evidence that only minimal doses of opioids are needed in cases where their prescription is called for.

Here's what dentists can do now: Take the free CE <u>webinars</u> on safe and effective opioid prescribing and review the <u>statement</u> on the use of opioids to treat dental pain. State and local dental societies should continue to share the <u>2018 Call to Action</u> with members, which outlines specific steps to help keep opioid pain relievers from becoming a source of harm.

Message from ADA President Dr. Joseph Crowley

In an article published this month by <u>Modern Healthcare</u>, I argue that in order to solve the complex challenges of dental care access, we have to address barriers that patients face and connect them to the care they need.

"Whichever side of the aisle you sit on, to change the status quo and create sustainable healthcare programs we need to start by looking at the real barriers underserved people face: low income, lack of awareness of available public health resources, low health literacy, and transportation and childcare challenges so adults who do make doctor appointments are able to keep them."

The ADA is dedicated to growing and promoting proven and evidence-based solutions that address these barriers. We need your help at the local level to initiate or increase the number of <u>Community Dental Health Coordinators</u> and Hospital <u>Emergency Department Referral Programs</u> to show how dentists are making a positive difference in eliminating barriers and increasing access to care. Assistance


