## President's Message As seen on TV!

Dear Colleagues,

In a controlled study<sup>1</sup>, medical students, a month away from graduation, were asked to score their own competency and skill in performing several medical procedures. Their self-assessment scores were



then compared to objective scores of the same students actually doing these procedures. The study found that self-perceived competence does not correlate well with objectively assessed competence. Similar studies have been done across professions and cultures with the same conclusion. In other words, what you and I think works may be very different from what science proves actually works.



One weekend last month, I spent a few hours watching two different events: The first was "Root Cause," a movie on Netflix about one man's journey of self-discovery and subsequent attempts to prove that a single root canal procedure might have left him with life-changing detrimental health impacts. The second event was

#### Government and Public Affairs Update



#### In Congress

#### Bipartisan Legislation to Reform McCarran-Ferguson Introduced in Congress

The ADA and dentists have been advocating for decades to repeal the 1945 McCarran-Ferguson Act antitrust exemption for the health insurance industry. This month, legislation was introduced in both chambers of Congress and is a win for dentistry.

In the Senate on Feb. 6 Sens. Steve Daines, R-Mont. and Patrick Leahy, D-Vt, introduced S. 350, the "Competitive Health Insurance Reform Act". The bipartisan bill would eliminate the limited exemption to the federal antitrust laws that health care insurance companies have enjoyed since the 1940s. The legislation would not interfere with the states' ability to enforce their own regulations, antitrust statutes and consumer protection laws.

The ADA hopes the effect of repeal will be to remove the apparent hesitancy of the Federal Trade Commission and the Justice Department to enforce the federal antitrust laws against health insurance companies engaged in anticompetitive conduct.

On Feb. 28 the House introduced a companion bill H.R. 1418 co-sponsored by Rep. Peter DeFazio, D-Ore. and Rep. Paul Gosar, R-Ariz. The bipartisan legislation also brought in 8 additional original cosponsors of the bill including: Rep. Warren Davidson R-Ohio, Rep. Scott DesJarlais, R-Tenn, Rep. John Garamendi D-Calif., Rep. Raul Grijalva D-Ariz, Rep. Stephen Lynch D-Mass, Rep. Gregory Meeks, D-N.Y., Rep. Ralph Norman R-S.C., and Rep. Ted Yoho R-Fla.

#### **Congress Advocates for Oral Health this Month**

In honor of National Children's Dental Health Month celebrated in February, several legislators, including our member dentists, helped put the spotlight on oral health on Capitol Hill.

Reps. Mike Simpson, R-Idaho, Paul Gosar, R-Ariz., Brian Babin, R-Texas, Drew Ferguson, R-Ga., Jeff Van Drew, D-N.J., and Elijah Cummings, D-Md., sent a Dear Colleague letter to every member of the House of Representatives, urging their fellow lawmakers to support issues important to oral health. All of the signees are dentists and ADA members with the exception of Rep. Cummings. Reps. Simpson and Cummings are the co-chairs of the Oral Health Caucus, which is dedicated to increase awareness of oral health care and emerging dental research.

In addition, <u>Rep. Mike Simpson</u>, Rep. Paul Gosar, <u>Rep. Jeff Van Drew</u> and Rep. Robin Kelly all issued tributes on the House floor in official <u>statements for the record</u> on the importance of oral health and the dedicated efforts honored by National Children's Dental Health Month in February.

#### **Ensuring Lasting Smiles Act Introduced**

The ADA and a coalition of health care groups led by the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons (AAOMS) sent a <u>letter of support</u> to the sponsors of the "Ensuring Lasting Smiles Act", legislation that will have a direct impact on patients and will eliminate the existing burdens that prevent access to necessary diagnosis and treatment.

Senators Tammy Baldwin, D-Wis., Joni Ernst, R-Iowa, Sherrod Brown, D-Ohio and Lisa Murkowski, R-Alaska <u>reintroduced</u> this bipartisan legislation in the Senate (S.560) to ensure health insurance coverage for needed treatment and procedures for individuals born with congenital anomalies or birth defects. ELSA would close a coverage gap to guarantee that health plans cover medically necessary services related to a patient's anomaly or birth defect, including any serious dental and oral-related procedures that are necessary to maintaining health and overall function.

Rep. Collin Peterson, D-Minn. and Rep. Denver Riggleman, R-Va. introduced the bi-partisan legislation in the House (H.R. 1379). Like its companion bill in the Senate, the Ensuring Lasting Smiles Act would ensure children born with congenital anomalies are able to receive the oral and dental care they need. The bill closes a coverage gap insurance companies use to deny certain procedures that are necessary for proper care.

#### **Dental Faculty Loan Repayment Program**

A coalition of dental organizations sent letters of support thanking the four cosponsors of the Dental Loan Repayment Assistance Act, H.R. 996. The <u>letter</u> to the House thanks Rep. Yvette Clarke, D-N.Y., Rep. Paul Gosar, R-Ariz, Rep. Michael Simpson R-Idaho and Rep. Grace Meng, D-N.Y. for their bipartisan support to allow full-time faculty members participating in the Dental Faculty Loan Repayment Program (DFLRP) to exclude from income the amount of the loan forgiveness from their federal income taxes.

The coalition also sent a <u>letter</u> of support to the cosponsors of the companion bill S. 359 introduced in the Senate by Sen. Ben Cardin, D-Md. and Sen. Roger Wicker, R-Miss. The legislation will benefit those making a difference to recruit and retain dental faculty by alleviating the tax burden of the loan repayment benefits. The DFLRP benefit will remain a critical factor in recruiting and retaining dental school faculty.

#### **Federal Agencies**

#### Comments to CMS about ACA

The ADA and the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry (AAPD) shared <u>comments</u> this month on February 19 with the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services' (CMS) proposed 2020 notice of benefit and payment parameters for the Affordable Care Act. In a joint letter, ADA President Jeffrey M. Cole and AAPD President Joseph B. Castellano told the agency they are concerned about the options given to states for selecting essential health benefit benchmark plans, particularly an option that allows states to select a set of benefits that would become the state's essential health benefit-benchmark plan. The two organizations said they believe that will give states the opportunity to weaken the essential health benefits, including the oral health benefit for children. The ADA and AAPD instead supported the offering and availability of comprehensive dental services to children under the essential health benefit as required by the ACA.

Both organizations also urged CMS not to defer to states for network adequacy reviews using the "reasonable access" standard and not to use the same standard for essential community providers as the agency did in 2019. They also asked CMS not to eliminate the actuarial value standards for standalone dental plans.

#### **Root Cause No Longer on Netflix**

Dear Fellow Leaders,

In January, I sent an email to all ADA members to help them respond to patients who had concerns about the film *Root Cause*, which makes baseless, unscientific claims about root canal treatment that could cause unwarranted alarm among viewers.

On behalf of patients around the world, the ADA, along with the American Association of Endodontists and the American Association for Dental Research, sent <u>a letter</u> to the platforms hosting the film and we are extremely pleased to see that Netflix has removed the film from its library.

The public deserves to have access to factual information to help them make informed decisions about their oral and overall health. A platform such as Netflix has the potential to reach more than a hundred million people. I consider the removal of this film from its library a win for public health.

As dentists, I am sure you find misleading "scientific claims" as frustrating as I do. They are especially dangerous in this era, as we see patients who seek dental care information from more sources than ever. The public is inquisitive. They want to be partners in their care. Most likely they have searched for relevant information online prior to a medical or dental appointment. At the ADA, we have referred to this behavior as consumerism in dentistry. It's here and it's intensifying.

In the coming years, I believe we will see more dental technology innovations and more creative ideas that respond to consumerism in dentistry. I invite you to watch this video about the nine drivers of health care consumerism.

The ADA is increasing its efforts to be the place to turn to for trusted information and resources to help members navigate consumerism in dentistry. We will continue to use our platform to promote accurate, science-based resources to the general public – like the ones on <a href="MouthHealthy.org">MouthHealthy.org</a>. I view consumerism in dentistry as an opportunity, an opportunity to have a deeper and even more informed doctor-patient relationship


