President's Message

As we head into the summer months and as hopefully all of you have been vaccinated, we are perhaps seeing an end to the restrictive life style we have had to endure through this pandemic. At this time we are seeing a shift in the logistical problems of being vaccinated from lack of supply to aspects of anti-vaccination public sentiment and more importantly a shortage of vaccinators. To that end members are reminded that the Montgomery and Prince Georges Counties' de-



partments of health are now accepting and encouraging dentist to be vaccinators. If you are interested in participating in the vaccine distribution task force you must become a member of The Maryland Medical Reserve Corp https://mdresponds.health.maryland.gov/. Once you are a registered member you will be an eligible vaccinator. Requirements include an active dental license. Once recruited you will be trained on-site in massimmunization protocols.

The legislative session in Annapolis came to an end with some frustration due to the pandemic social distancing mandates but with some successes. The Task Force bill was passed which will evaluate more clearly what barriers there are in Maryland to accessing Dental Care. The Board of Dental Examiners was charged to study issues related to the streamlining of disciplinary processes and the mechanism of nominating members to the State Board of Dental Examiners. Positive changes were also made to the Maryland Medicaid program regarding frequency of prophylactic services and extension of post partum benefits. SMDS Trustee to MSDA Report

May 13, 2021



The 2021 (mostly virtual) Maryland Legislative Session ended last month but the work of your MSDA Legislative Committee and MARPAC continue year. Attached to the report is the comprehensive Legislative Bill Summary from our outstanding lobbying team of Fran and Dan Doherty. Make sure you wake up each Saturday AM with a cup of coffee and our emailed MSDA Advocacy Page. Each week we provide updated information on legislation, regulations, and recommendations that you need to know for your practice and the profession of dentistry.

I have heard numerous members stating they are having a difficult time finding staff to help their offices run efficiently as we slowly recover from the pandemic. I took your concerns to this week's MSDA Board of Trustees meeting and

made a resolution that the MSDA commit unused dental axillary funds to help solve this problem. The Board of Trustees agreed and we will utilize the public relations talents of Mrs. MSDA's Beth Lavine to promote dental assisting as a great long-term career. In speaking with Beth, the initial plan is to contact the Maryland Department of Education and school districts across Maryland to collaborate on how best to get our message across to young high school and college students. To make the program work, we will rely on MSDA members to be the contact individuals when young individuals express an interest in becoming part of the dental team. Stay tune for more information as this program develops but please start talking and mentoring young people. Once you have a person who shows great potential, the SMDS and the MSDA have certified programs to help you train that individual. All you have to do is ask, you may find a great future employee!

Speaking of asking, your MDSA President-Elect Dr. Steve Dargan is looking for interested individuals to serve on various MSDA Committees for 2021-22. The time commitment for most committees is unusually one evening every couple of months and currently it is all virtual. The knowledge you obtain and mentorship is well worth the time commitment. Key committees are Young Dentist, Membership, Diversity & Inclusion, and the Legislative Affairs Committee. The 2021 Session of the Maryland General Assembly ended April 12, 2021. Due to the Pandemic, this Session was conducted in an unprecedented manner. Basically, all aspects of the Session – hearings, subcommittee meetings, voting sessions - were conducted virtually. Testimony could be provided only if an individual signed -up to testify 2 business days prior to the hearing between the hours of 8 am and 3 pm. The number of witnesses were limited, thus necessitating that MSDA provide written testimony on most bills. The hearings and other meetings were conducted exclusively by Zoom. Participation during work sessions and subcommittee meetings was contingent on being sent a Zoom Link. Often some interested parties did not receive the opportunity to participate. These difficult procedures resulted in a difficult and frustrating experience.

Legislation directly affecting dentistry:

- HB 368/SB 100 Task Force on Oral Health in Maryland. This legislation establishes a Task Force comprised of representatives from dental organizations, patient advocacy groups, public health, dental education and more. It is to be co-chaired by the Dean of the Maryland Dental School and the Deputy Health Secretary for Public Health. It is to investigate and study the status of oral health in Maryland and the obstacles to Marylanders receiving appropriate and adequate dental Care. Both HB 368 and SB 100 PASSED.
- HB 1030 State Board of Dental Examiners Membership Nominations and Appointment Process. This bill would have eliminated the current nomination process for SBDE dentist vacancies. Under this process the Board conducts a ballot/election by all licensed dentist for the nominees submitted by recognized dental organizations and petition nominees supported by 15 signatures of licensed dentists. Following the vote, the votes are tabulated and the list of all nominees and the number of votes they received is submitted to the Governor. This bill eliminated the Board's ballot process, and would have required that all nominees come from qualified dental organizations or as nominees by petition, and these nominations be submitted directly to the Governor. The bill did not provide any methodology to notify licensed dentists of the names or numbers of nominees sent to the Governor. The House of Delegates passed the bill. MSDA adamantly opposed HB 1030 and was able to prevent it from being heard in the Senate. **FAILED**
- HB 708 State Board of Dental Examiners Dispositions and Summary Suspensions Time Periods. This bill would have imposed limitations on the State Board processing and adjudicating disciplinary actions within a specified number of days. Under the bill, if the Board failed to finalize its adjudication of the issues timely, the respondent licensee was deemed to prevail. The Health Occupation Subcommittee decided to roll this into a Study under SB 836 (See below).

SB 836 – State Board of Dental Examiners – Disciplinary Process and Appointment Process Report.

This bill as amended establishes the State Board of Dental Examiners Disciplinary Process and Actions Report. The Board is required to study and make recommendations regarding revisions necessary to improve the process of disciplining dentists and the disclosure of disciplinary actions. The task force consists of (1) one member of the Senate of Maryland; (2) one member of the House of Delegates; (3) the Attorney General (or designee); (4) two members of SBDE; (5) two members of the Maryland State Dental Association; (6) one member of the Maryland Dental Hygienists' Association; (7) one member of the faculty of the University of Maryland School of Dentistry; and (8) two consumer advocates. The members in attendance at the first meeting of the task force must choose one of the two members of SBDE to serve as chair of the task force.

The task force must study: \cdot how many complaints are filed annually; \cdot how a complaint is filed; \cdot who is eligible to file a complaint; \cdot the length of time a complaint is open; \cdot the timeframe to provide updates and a resolution to the complainant; \cdot the manner in which disciplinary action from the board is publicly reported; and \cdot whether a dentist should be required to carry malpractice insurance.

The SBDE is to report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly by December 1, 2021. **PASSED**

- SB 808 Health Occupations Licensed Dentists- Administration of Vaccines. This bill was introduced at the request of the SBDE establishing standards and criteria that would need to be met by a licensed dentist to administer vaccinations. MSDA is of the opinion that legislation is not required to authorize dentists to administer vaccines, and the implementation of requirements are appropriate through the SBDE's regulatory process. The bill was heard in the Senate Committee March 2, 2021, but no further action was taken on the bill. **FAILED.**
- HB 28/SB 5 Public Health Implicit Bias Training and the Office of Minority Health and Health Disparities. : The Cultural and Linguistic Health Care Professional Competency Program, in coordination with OMHHD, must identify and approve implicit bias training programs that must be recognized by a health occupations board or accredited by the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME). This bill requires applicants for the renewal of a license or certificate issued by a health occupations board to attest to completion of an approved implicit bias training program the first time they renew their license or certificate after April 1, 2022. Beginning in fiscal 2023, the Governor must include in the annual budget bill an appropriation for the Office of Minority Health and Health Disparities (OMHHD) that is the greater of either \$1,788,314 or 0.012% of the total funds appropriated to the Maryland Department of Health (MDH) in that fiscal year. OMHHD must publish on its website (and update at least every six months) health data that includes race and ethnicity information it collects. PASSED.
- HB 1125 Prescription Drug Monitoring Program Prescribers of Opioids Notification Requirements. This bill would have required prescribers of opioids of a certain dosage to notify PDMP that the patient had been educated on the risks of opioid use, has been informed that overdose reversal drugs are available, and that an overdose drug had been prescribed. MSDA opposed this bill, and no further action was taken by the Committee. FAILED.

- HB 547/SB 485 Maryland Medical Assistance Programs Dental Prophylaxis Care and Oral Health Exams. These bills requires that The Maryland Medical Assistance Programs conform its requirements for frequency between prophylaxis treatments with the requirements required for commercial dental insurance. Thus, Medicaid may not require that the intervals between prophylaxis treatments and oral health exams be more than 140 days. PASSED.
- SB 923 Maryland Medical Assistance Program Eligibility. This bill requires Medicaid, subject to the limitations of the State budget, to extend coverage for eligible pregnant women with family incomes up to 250% of the federal poverty level (FPL) for one year immediately following the end of the woman's pregnancy. Coverage must include dental care (in addition to comprehensive medical and other health care services under current law). The bill takes effect January 1, 2022. PASSED.
- **HB 123/SB 3 Preserve Telehealth Access Act of 2021 –** In general, these bills expand the definitions of "telehealth" and the coverage and reimbursement requirements for health care services provided through telehealth for both Medicaid and private insurance. Carriers must reimburse for a covered service appropriately provided through telehealth, as specified in the bills. **PASSED**.

Legislation involving Employer/Employee Covid issues.

- 1. HB 581 Labor and Employment Employment Standards During an Emergency (Maryland Essential Workers Protection Act) At the request of various unions, numerous bills were introduced addressing employment safety and health issues during a declared emergency, as well as employment requirements during a catastrophic health emergency. The bills covered issues such as: bereavement and health leave, hazard pay, required safety and health programs, and much more. Most of the bills applied to employees of essential employers which as originally defined encompassed a major portion of the health care industry. The bills as introduced would have had a very significant financial impact on dental practices. After many work group meetings and subcommittee work sessions a vastly revised HB 581 was passed by the House of Delegates, and subsequently the bill was further amended by the Senate.
 - Broadly, the bill establishes the following rights, benefits, responsibilities, and obligations related to essential workers, essential employers, and catastrophic health emergencies:
 - · An essential employer must provide safe working conditions during an emergency and, subject to availability, necessary amounts of safety equipment at no cost to essential workers, as specified.
 - · An essential employee has a right to refuse to perform an assigned task, as specified.
 - · An essential employer must take proactive steps to minimize the risk of transmission of the communicable disease that is the subject of the emergency, including paying for an essential employee to be tested for the disease under certain circumstances.
 - · An essential employer must provide an essential worker with public health emergency leave when federal or State funding is made available for that purpose, calculated based on an employee's average working hours, as specified.
 - · An essential employer may not knowingly misclassify an essential worker as an independent contractor or other classification to avoid any other benefits due to an essential worker during an emergency

- · Maryland Department of Labor (MDL) and specified offices within MDL (1) are generally responsible for enforcing the bill and must report to the General Assembly by January 1, 2022, concerning COVID-19 enforcement activities and (2) must adopt an emergency temporary standard, as specified.
- · Maryland Department of Health (MDH) must, in consultation with MDL and local health departments, develop a template health emergency preparedness plan for responding to catastrophic health emergencies.

The bill will apply to the current pandemic prospectively from the date the Governor signs the bill. Its provisions will be effective until 6 months after the state of emergency ends. It will to apply to any future catastrophic health emergencies. **PASSED**

2. HB 1199/SB 813 - Workers' Compensation – Occupational Disease Presumptions - Covid. (See also, HB 765, HB 1247/SB 725 and SB 812) - All of these bills were introduced to classify Covid-19 under the Workers Compensation Statute as an occupational disease. They also would have established that an employee who contracts Covid-19 is presumed to have contracted the virus in the course of their employment. MSDA strongly opposed these bills and none of them were acted on by the General Assembly. FAILED

3. HB 508/SB 210 – Covid 19 Claim – Civil Immunity. (See also, HB 25/SB 311, HB 1084, and HB 1106 – These bills would have granted civil immunity to health providers and/or to many businesses to varying degrees during the period of declared emergency for the pandemic. MSDA supported several of these bills, however none of them received favorable consideration by the Legislature. **FAILED**

Fran and I wish to recognize those dentists who participated in the Virtual Dentist Day/Dentist Week. It is by participation of dentists that MSDA is able to effectively educate Maryland's delegates and senators about issues critical to dentistry and our patients. Special recognition and thanks are also due to: Dr. Charles Doring, Chairman of the LAC. In addition, the efforts of Dr. Tom a'Becket were especially critical in the passage of HB 368 and SB 100 (Task Force) and the defeat of HB 1030 (SBDE Nominations). As always, thanks to Greg Buckler, Dorian Birkholz, MSDA's superb Public Relations and Communications consultant Beth Levine, and the Officers and Trustees of the MSDA. To all of you our heartfelt thanks.

Introduction: Enhance your understanding of the issues of pediatric laser dentistry, including tongue-ties and lip-ties! As many as 5 percent of all babies born in the US have tongue-ties significant enough to cause breastfeeding difficulties. Affected babies often fail to thrive and can be erroneously labeled as "lazy nursers" or "stubborn feeders".

A good surgical laser for cutting soft tissue must be able to vaporize soft tissue, while at the same time efficiently coagulating surgical margins. Not all laser wavelengths are suitable to comply with both requirements. 


